# How to Find Things in the Bible

The Bible is really a <u>LIBRARY</u> consisting of <u>73</u> books.

The Old Testament has <u>46</u> books.

The New Testament has <u>27</u> books.

The Bible's <u>TABLE</u> of <u>CONTENTS</u> helps us to navigate through the Books of the Bible

First, it helps to know that the names of the Books of the Bible are <u>ABBREVIATED</u>

Give the proper abbreviations for the following Books:

- Deuteronomy <u>Dt</u>
- Isaiah <u>Is</u>
- Amos <u>Am</u>
- Matthew <u>Mt</u>
- First Corinthians <u>1Cor</u>

Passages in the Bible are identified by <u>BOOK</u>, <u>CHAPTER</u>, and <u>VERSE</u>. In the example **1Pt 2:1-4**, the book is represented by <u>1Pt</u>, the chapter is represented by <u>2</u>:, and the verses are represented by <u>1-4</u>.

With that in mind, find the passage Jn 3:16 in your Bible and write out the verse below:

# **Bible Timeline**

The events of the Bible represent the story of our <u>SALVATION</u> history over a period of several <u>THOUSAND</u> years.

Some parts of the Bible are considered <u>PRE-HISTORY</u> meaning that the events described cannot be assigned <u>HISTORICAL</u> dates. Some examples include: <u>CREATION</u> <u>ADAM AND EVE</u> <u>CAIN AND ABEL</u> <u>THE FLOOD (NOAH'S ARK)</u> <u>THE TOWER OF BABEL</u>

The Old Testament timeline begins with the story of <u>ABRAHAM</u> in the year 1850 BC.

The Period around 1800 BC is known as the Period of the <u>PATRIARCHS</u> which means "fathers." List some examples: <u>ISAAC JACOB JOSEPH</u>

The major event that happened around 1280 BC is known as the <u>EXODUS</u> and describes how <u>MOSES</u> led the Jewish people out of slavery in <u>EGYPT</u> to the Promised Land.

Give an example of one of the Judges (1150 BC) <u>GIDEON, SAMSON, DEBORAH,</u> <u>SAMUEL.</u>

The Period of Kings began around the year <u>1000 BC</u>. The greatest king of Israel was <u>DAVID</u>. The King who built the Temple in Jerusalem was <u>SOLOMON</u>

Give an example of one of the prophets (750 BC) <u>ELIJAH, ISAIAH, JEREMIAH,</u> <u>EZEKIEL</u>.

The Northern Kingdom of Israel fell in the year <u>721 BC</u> and the Southern Kingdom fell in the year <u>587 BC</u> beginning the <u>EXILE</u> in Babylon.

A.D. stands for ANNO DOMINI (YEAR OF OUR LORD.

## **How Catholics Understand the Bible**

Give one example of something the Bible tells us that is hard to understand: <u>CREATION IN 7 DAYS, ADAM LIVED TO BE 930 YRS OLD, NOAH'S ARK, ETC.</u>

Catholics believe that everything in the Bible is <u>TRUE</u> but not necessarily <u>FACT</u>

Give an example of something that is TRUE but not FACT: IT'S RAINING CATS AND DOGS; MY MOM IS GONNA KILL ME

We say that these are examples of <u>FIGURATIVE</u> language.

Figurative language was used <u>OCCASIONALLY</u> in the Bible, especially in the earliest parts of the <u>OLD TESTAMENT</u>.

So you can learn about creation in <u>SCIENCE</u> class AND <u>RELIGION</u> class. Both teach <u>TRUTH</u> Your science teacher will teach <u>SCIENTIFIC</u> truth and the Bible will teach you <u>RELIGIOUS</u> truth.

We recognize that sometimes numbers used in the Bible (for example, Jesus fasted for 40 days and 40 nights) are <u>SYMBOLIC</u> but that the story teaches us an important <u>TRUTH</u> about our faith.

Your <u>CATECHIST</u> will help you to know when <u>FIGURATIVE</u> language is being used in the Bible. The key is to always ask, "what is the <u>TRUTH</u> that God is teaching me in this Bible story?"

## The Bible at Mass

The first major part of the Mass is called the LITURGY of the WORD

On Sunday, the Liturgy of the Word has <u>3</u> Scripture readings.

The first Scripture Reading is usually from the <u>OLD</u> Testament.

The second Scripture Reading is taken from the <u>LETTERS</u> of the New Testament.

In between the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> readings, we respond with one of the <u>PSALMS</u>

The third Scripture Reading is from the GOSPEL.

The Scripture readings for the Mass are arranged in a book called the LECTIONARY

Over the course of a  $\underline{3}$  year cycle, we hear many stories from the Bible.

Which Gospel do the following cycles draw from:

Cycle A MATTHEW Cycle B MARK Cycle C LUKE
